Specifically, ₹17,00,000 was sanctioned for sports equipment, storage facilities, and an indoor gymnasium, with an additional ₹7,00,000 proposal for an open gymnasium pending approval. The study highlights that strong sports records significantly improve the likelihood of funding approvals, leading to the enhancement of sports and related physical facilities. It recommends promoting active student participation, maintaining detailed sports records, and strengthening collaboration with sports authorities to maximize development opportunities. The results underscore that prioritizing sports can simultaneously advance both student performance and institutional infrastructure.
